In most cases, with careful planning you will be able to fulfill IHCC curriculum objectives, while also completing coursework that Bethel requires. **Here are some additional guidelines to consider:**

- Most courses required for a specific academic major should be taken at Bethel.**
- Any IHCC course taken to satisfy a requirement for a major at Bethel should be approved by the specific academic department at Bethel.**
- Bethel's programs are designed to be completed in 4 years. Early communication with you will allow Bethel to help you to determine when it is best for you to transfer.**
- Courses that are listed under more than one category can only count once. Students can choose which category they prefer.**
- A grade of 'C' or higher is required on each course to be accepted by Bethel.**
