This transfer guide is designed to help a student at Rainy River Community College easily choose courses to take at Rainy River CC that will satisfy Bethel general education (core curriculum) requirements through Spring 2007. Unless otherwise indicated, one (1) course from each area will satisfy that gen ed requirement. Pages 14-30 in the 2006-2007 Bethel catalog provides further information regarding Bethel's transfer and general education requirements. In most cases, with careful planning you will be able to fulfill Rainy River CC or Minnesota Transfer curriculum objectives, while also completing coursework that Bethel requires. Contact Bethel or Rainy River CC for assistance with your planning.

Here are some additional guidelines to consider:

- Most courses required for a specific academic major should be taken at Bethel. Students in majors that have sequential courses (such as the Sciences) must pre-plan carefully with the specific department at Bethel.
- Any Rainy River course taken to satisfy a requirement for a major at Bethel should be approved by the specific academic department at Bethel.
- Bethel's programs are designed to be completed in 4 years. Early communication with you will allow Bethel to help you to determine when with you will allow Bethel to help you to determine when it is best for you to transfer.
- Courses that are listed under more than one category can only count once. Students can choose which category they prefer.
- A grade of 'C' or higher is required on each course to be accepted by Bethel.
