\* GES145, 146, 245, and 246 Western Humanity in Christian Perspective I-IV may be substituted for the highlighted courses. These four courses MUST be taken sequentially – 145 (fall, freshman), 146 (spring, freshman), 245 (fall, sophomore), and 246 (spring, sophomore). Since the Western Humanities program is 1 credit less than the 5 separate Gen Ed courses, the student must ADD 1 additional elective credit in order to meet the total credits required for graduation. v Students enrolled in the Humanities program should take an elective during sophomore interim and GES246 in sophomore spring.

\*\* Students must complete through the second semester of a first year language course or equivalent. (Check the Catalog for details of this option.)

▪ This program assumes a student will use BUS100M or MAT131M to meet the general education mathematics requirement.
