\* GES145, 146, 245, and 246 Western Humanity in Christian Perspective I-IV may be substituted for the highlighted courses. These four courses MUST be taken sequentially – 145 (fall, freshman), 146 (spring, freshman), 245 (fall, sophomore), and 246 (spring, sophomore). Since the Western Humanities program is 1 credit less than the 5 separate Gen Ed courses, the student must ADD 1 additional elective credit in order to meet the total credits required for graduation. Students enrolled in the Humanities program should take an elective during sophomore interim and GES246 in sophomore spring.

\*\* Students must complete through the second semester of a first year language course or equivalent. (Check the Catalog for details of this option.)

▪ This program assumes a student will use BUS100M or MAT131M and ANT242E(U) or SOC204E (U) or PSY220E (U) to meet the general education Mathematics and World Cultures requirements.

Most financial aid packages stipulate 12 credits/semester; Minnesota state grants are reduced when credit load falls below 15 credits/semester. (Interim credits may be split between fall and spring for state grant purposes only.)
