\* GES145, 146, 245, and 246 Western Humanity in Christian Perspective I-IV may be substituted for the highlighted courses. These four courses **MUST** be taken sequentially – 145 (fall, freshman), 146 (spring, freshman), 245 (fall, sophomore), and 246 (spring, sophomore). Since the Western Humanities program is 1 credit less than the 5 separate Gen Ed courses, the student must **ADD 1 additional elective credit** in order to meet the total credits required for graduation. Students in the Humanities program should take their Lab Science course during spring of their freshman year.

▪ This program assumes a student will use BUS100M or MAT131M, BUS202E (U), and BUS370G to meet the general education Mathematics, World Cultures, and Comparative Systems requirements.

Most financial aid packages stipulate 12 credits/semester; Minnesota state grants are reduced when credit load falls below 15 credits/semester. (Interim credits may be split between fall and spring for state grant purposes only.)
