These four courses MUST be taken sequentially – 145 (fall, freshman), 146 (spring, freshman), 245 (fall, sophomore), and 246 (spring, sophomore). Since the Western Humanities program is 1 credit less than the 5 separate Gen Ed courses, the student must ADD 1 additional elective credit in order to meet the total credits required for graduation. Students in the Humanities program should take their Lab Science course in spring of their freshman year.
